NEW GENOA. NEW ANNEX MOTOR MALTA. VAIGRAGE TO BE RE GLUED IN THE FORWARD CABIN STARBOARD AND TOILET. The First 375 is a sailboat built by the Bénéteau shipyard in 1987. This model is part of the First range, which was well recognized for its fast and performing cruising sailboats. Here are some key pieces of information about the 1987 First 375: **Design and Characteristics** Type: Cruise-performance, with a design intended to offer good regatta capabilities while remaining comfortable for cruising. Length Overall (LOA): 11.42 m (37 feet). Beam: 3.75 m. Draft: Approximately 1.60 m (depending on the version), which allows for good navigation in shallow waters while offering good stability. The First 375 is therefore a versatile sailboat, appreciated by sailors who wish to combine performance and comfort.
